



Tips for creating a pollinator garden

Start a pollinator friendly garden to support your local pollinator species!

Use native plants

Native pollinators thrive when they can find native plant species! Native plants are adapted to local sun and soil conditions, won't need as much maintenance, and planting them will reduce the spread of invasive species.

Use a variety of plants

Different pollinators prefer different flowers. Using a variety of flower blooming times, colours, shapes, and sizes in your garden ensures that all pollinators will love your garden and you'll have visitors all season long!

Consider shelter and water

Pollinators need shelter and water. You can provide shelter by adding trees and shrubs or by making a bee hotel! If you have a bird bath, add some stones so that butterflies and bees can rest without drowning!

Avoid pesticides

Reducing chemicals is helpful for pollinators, pets, and people!
