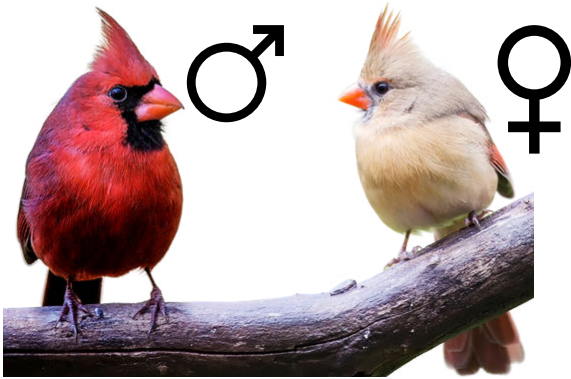

# COMMON KINGSTON BIRD IDENTIFICATION GUIDE



**Northern Cardinal:** Long-tailed with a short bill and prominent crest. Males are brilliant red and females are pale brown.



**Blue Jay:** Blue back, crest and wings with a black collar and white stomach.



**Cedar Waxwing:** Short, wide bill with a pale brown head and crest, and pale yellow stomach.



**Black-capped Chickadee:** Black cap and throat, white cheeks and brown sides and white stomach.



**Red-breasted Nuthatch:** Orange-red stomach with a black cap and eye stripe.



**White-breasted Nuthatch:** Upside down on trees with a white face and black cap.



**American Robin:** Large, round, gray-brown bodies. Warm, orange-brown stomach and dark heads.

**Mourning Dove:** Long, streamlined shape with a small head, thick chest and small beak.

**Rose-breasted Grosbeak:** Stocky, medium-sized songbird with a triangular bill. Males have a red nape and females are brown and heavily streaked.

**American Goldfinch:** Spring males are bright yellow with a black cap and wings. Females and winter birds are paler, but still identifiable by their conical bill, wing bars, and pointed tail.



**Common Grackle:** Tapered bill with glossy, iridescent body and purple or blue head and a golden eye.

**American Crow:** Large body size with a thick, straight beak.

**Common Raven:** Very large body size with a long, thick, slightly curved beak.



**Downy Woodpecker:** Short beak and males have a red spot. Small size (~6.5")

**Red-bellied Woodpecker:** Red head and nape, appears pale. Similar size to a blue jay.

**Hairy Woodpecker:** Long, chisel-like beak and males have a red spot. Similar in size to a blue jay.
