# Wampum Inspired Bead Art

Note: An Indigenous Community member must be invited into the learning environment to deliver beadwork teachings.

### Instructions:

- 1.On 15 column & 5 row square chart, have students create a Wampum inspired design describing who they are.
- 2. Start by having students make their own loom; on a pre-cut (13 in x 3.5 in) piece of cardboard have students cut 6 slits on each end.
- 3. Wrap each slit with thread, taping the thread down with tape at the back.
- 4. Using another piece of thread and a plastic needle, have students tie their needle thread to the loom thread.
- 5.On the needle thread, have students load their pony beads according to the design that they previously made. Each bead should settle in between the loom thread.
- 6.To secure the beads, slide the needle around the end of the loom thread and back through the beads. This will keep the beads in place.
- 7. Repeat the pattern until all the columns are filled according to the students' design.
- 8. When students are finished, take the taped thread on the back of the loom, and tie it off. This will complete the students' art.

## Materials Needed:

- Cardboard Pieces
   (precut into 13in x 3.5in)
- Thread
- Variety of Pony Beads
- Tape
- Design Paper (15 columns and 5 rows)
- Markers
- Plastic Needles
- Scissors

### Bead Pattern:

Columns 1-5: A bead design that represents your cultural background (this can be flags, or a pattern that demonstrates your background) Columns 6-10: A bead design that represents factors of influence in your life (friends, family, tv shows, music, etc.)
Columns 11-15: A bead design that represents your aspirations.

## After Activity:

- If there is enough time for students to share their Wampum-inspired designs, make small groups for students to share with their seat neighbours.
- If students require more time, bring a plastic box for students to store their designs safely.
